Hope Close to Home - Northwest Indiana

The Hope Hub Opens

On June 17, God provided a place where families could walk in and be welcomed. Since opening our doors, the Hope Hub has become a space for prayer, connection, training, and gospel-centered support. In addition to our bi-monthly classes and special events, parents can take Bright Course classes to receive biblically based helpful instruction on family matters and then are encouraged and empowered by earning Hope Bucks to acquire supplies, clothes, toys and more.

Hope Packed into Every Backpack

More than 75 families in Northwest Indiana were supported through our Good News Backpack Giveaway. **185 backpacks** were placed into children's hands—each one filled not only with school supplies, but also with the Good News of the Gospel.



Reaching Women in Crisis

The BCH team provided trauma-informed, bi-weekly gatherings in our local county jail. **200 women** heard the truth of the Gospel, built relationships, and received encouragement in a place often marked by isolation.

Serving Our Neighbors

At Daybreak Shelter, families participated in a trauma-informed class. Nearly **90 individuals** participated over the six-week course. Alongside a warm meal, families were reminded they are seen, valued, and loved.

Strengthening the Church

Trauma-informed training was also offered in church settings, equipping youth workers to better support children carrying unseen burdens—helping churches care wisely and compassionately.



Because God's people gave, hope met families right where they were.

A Child Again — Gaithanliu, India

Gaithanliu lost both of her parents at a young age and was burdened with adult responsibilities that replaced her childhood. Through our Christ-centered care, she is now safe, learning, and growing.

Today, Gaithanliu is in 5th grade, thriving academically and physically. She loves singing and skipping—simple joys that reflect healing. Most importantly, she is growing spiritually and dreaming of becoming a nurse, so she can one day care for others.



A School Rising — Gbonota Village, Liberia

In a small village in Liberia, **Peter**, age seven, climbed palm trees to make palm oil—selling it to help pay for school. Education mattered that much.

For years, their village school was inconsistent and unreliable. The desire to learn was there—but opportunity was not.

Through God's provision and faithful partners, **a new school is being built**, led by the local church and the village residents. During construction, children like Peter carried buckets of sand—walking miles to help build the very school they will attend.

Brick by brick, hope is rising.

A Family Restored — “Benjamin”

When crisis struck a young mother in our NW Indiana community, she reached out for help—knowing her son needed safety while she sought healing. Through BCH, “Benjamin”, age three, was welcomed into a **Care Family** who provided stability, love, and faith-filled support.

In January 2026, mother and son were **reunited and continue receiving ongoing care**. This is the heart of our mission: keeping families together whenever possible and trusting God to redeem even the hardest seasons.

Christmas Blessings

Over **400 Christmas ornaments** on local church trees resulted in **\$15,000+** in gifts, clothing, and supplies for NW Indiana families. Internationally, over **400 children** received gifts and shared special Christmas meals. In Gbonota Village, students celebrated together in joy and gratitude.

At Christmas, our **GEM Home and Grace Home in Myanmar** opened their doors to their surrounding community, sharing food, fellowship, and the love of **Emmanuel—God with us**. Through their neighborhood outreach festivals, families gathered to celebrate, hear the Gospel, and experience the joy of Christ together.



• Children Sponsored in 2025

45 children around the world are currently supported through BCH child sponsorship—receiving care, education, and Christ-centered discipleship. Most importantly, they are covered in prayer by their dedicated sponsors.

• Total Giving

Churches and individual supporters came together to provide \$1,170,272 in annual donations, making this work possible and forming a growing community united by compassion, faith, and shared purpose.

\$581,000 was invested directly in international care and \$461,000 in strengthening families across the U.S., as we steward God's resources carefully and prioritize placing every dollar where it creates the greatest impact.

• Churches Visited: 40

Our BCH team shared the mission, built relationships, and invited churches to partner in caring for children and families—working together for Kingdom impact.

• Conferences Attended: 7

BCH staff represented the ministry at national and local conferences, sharing stories, learning, and connecting with others serving vulnerable children.

• Local Community Events: 15

BCH met new friends and collaborators throughout Northwest Indiana, sharing ideas, building relationships, and introducing the ministry to new partners.

• We Hosted Two Pastor & Church Leader Breakfasts

These meaningful gatherings with local pastors and church leaders strengthened relationships, prayer, and shared vision across Northwest Indiana churches.

• Local Family Support

Through our food pantry and Hope Hub, local families received practical help—including over 1,800 diapers—meeting urgent needs with dignity and care.

• Hope in the Hub

Participants attended over 400 BrightCourse classes, gaining Gospel-centered wisdom designed to strengthen families and build healthy homes. As families participate, they earn **Hope Bucks**, which help provide essential items such as supplies, clothing, and toys—meeting practical needs while encouraging growth, responsibility, and hope.

• Two International Visits

Our team visited children and families in the **Dominican Republic** and **Africa**, listening, learning, and assessing how best to strengthen families and communities—so children can remain with their families whenever possible.
